

PROCESS TO DATE





 - Openness to newcomers and desire to better integrate new, larger employers




SURVEY HIGHLIGHTS




SURVEY OVERVIEW

- Open from July 18 to August 12
- 132 completed Resident surveys and 13 completed Business surveys
- Major communications support
 - A postcard mailer 8308 copies sent to residents, businesses and farms
 - Digital boards at Pitt Meadows City Hall and on Lougheed Highway
 - A ¼ page Maple Ridge-Pitt Meadows newspaper ad
 - Pittmeadows.ca website page and front-page spotlight
 - 22 social media posts, a boosted post, and a social media ad
 - Email sent to all City of Pitt Meadows staff
 - Featured in City Talks newsletter published in the Maple Ridge News
 - Featured in Quarterly Report published in the Maple Ridge News




IF WORK ELSEWHERE, INTERESTED IN WORKING IN PITT MEADOWS?




SATISFACTION WITH LIFESTYLE FACTORS

BUSINESS SURVEY - SATISFACTION




PENDING RESEARCH ON PITT MEADOWS ECONOMY

Significant work remaining pending final Census release

* Growing employment and evolving industrial strengths

* Changing balance of jobs and workers (commuting flows)

* Evolving skill and education profile of resident workforce (people are the greatest economic asset!)

STRATEGIC DIRECTIONS (DRAFT)

- 1. Improve the economy's building blocks
- 2. Support local businesses
- 3. Support a viable and growing agriculture sector
- 4. Support growth and enhanced economic value of tourism
- 5. Pursue other growth opportunities

#1 ECONOMY'S BUILDING BLOCKS

- Commercial Space Increase supply of commercial space (North Lougheed, City Centre (Harris), existing mall/retail areas
- Labour Supply Support matching of local labour supply and demand
- Telecom Infrastructure Ensure wired and cellular telecom infrastructure is at least comparable to other regional communities (cellphone coverage identified as current weakness)
- Transportation System Advocate for improved public transit, continue with road network enhancements (including to account for pending major expansion of Amazon footprint), better integrate airport



#2 LOCAL BUSINESSES

- Leverage the City's information and communication tools to increase awareness of local business community (online or printed maps or directories, business profiles)
- Enhance the economic benefits of tourism by improving physical and information linkages (e.g., signage) to commercial areas
- Improve key public amenities for visitors (e.g., public washrooms)
- Airport expansion and operations as a key economic driver (note airport growth covered under #5)
- Ensure bylaws are not creating unnecessary limitations on business viability and growth



#3 AGRICULTURE

- Drainage improvements and managing invasive species
- Enhance awareness of agricultural value among City staff and general public
- Advocacy with regional, provincial, federal officials when issues benefit from a coordinated response
- Support for adoption of emerging agritech innovations
- Supporting solutions for temporary worker housing

#4 TOURISM

- Communication and marketing support through City channels
- Enhance the economic benefits of tourism by improving physical and information linkages (e.g., signage) to commercial areas
- Support special events celebrating the arts, holiday seasons, local food, etc.
- Recognize virtuous circle between tourism development and amenities for residents





#5 OTHER OPPORTUNITIES

- Airport waterfront development
- Airport industrial expansion
- Knowledge-based industries, leveraging lifestyle factors and housing affordability
- Post-Secondary Institution (possibly with coursework and/or research facilities related to agriculture, valuable linkages to agriculture, other sectors)
- Film sector expansion through increased outreach, and effective management to ensure impacted businesses are fairly compensated
- Expanded commercial amenities (entertainment, food and beverage, arts and culture) to enhance local livability and continue attracting young families and skilled workers/entrepreneurs


