H. DELEGATIONS AND PRESENTATIONS

H.1 Property Assessments Explained

Kim Turik, Deputy Assessor, BC Assessment, presented an overview of the BC Assessment roll and the relationship between property taxes and assessments.

I. <u>PUBLIC HEARINGS</u>

I.1 Metro Vancouver Non-market Housing and Childcare Project at 19085 119B Avenue

Mayor MacDonald opened the public hearing at 7:09 p.m.

Colin O'Byrne, Manager of Planning, presented an overview of the bylaws and historical staff report related to the project. Mr. O'Byrne confirmed the receipt of a petition for those against the development which is included as Attachment 1 and forms part of the original minutes.

Mayor MacDonald then read aloud the public hearing process statement and invited members of the public to make comment for the first time with the following members of the community engaging:

<u>Pat De Luca</u>, Wesbrooke Representative - regarding consideration of alternative uses for the property, concerns for impact on Wesbrooke residents, mechanisms in place for standards of care for the property.

<u>Maureen Robertson</u>, Pitt Meadows - concern of radius used for Notice of Public Hearing and impacts to surrounding neighbours during construction phase. In favour of the project overall.

Dan Kosicki, Pitt Meadows - regarding concerns of inadequate allocation of parking to the Senior Centre and assurance that standards of property care are maintained akin to that of the Wesbrooke.

<u>Leigh Rollins</u>, Metro Vancouver - regarding Metro Vancouver's mandate, the selection process undertaken for the community project and engagement opportunities.

<u>Rachel Hess</u>, Pitt Meadows – spoke in support of the daycare expansion that the project allows to further support child care needs in the community.

<u>Don Mitchell</u>, RMSS Representative – recognizes the need for such housing and anticipates natural synergies between the Seniors Centre and residents of the new development; expressed concern for parking impacts to those that use the Senior Centre during the construction phase and afterwards.

Mayor MacDonald invited members of the public to make comment for the second time with the following members of the community engaging:

<u>Pat De Luca</u>, Wesbrooke Representative – requesting stronger communication and collaboration relating to the shared driveway; disappointed that the architect had communicated that the development would be no more than 4 storeys and now it is 6 storeys.

<u>Bob Rhea</u>, Pitt Meadows - supportive of affordable housing, but concerned that the School Board is not aware of potential future impact to neighbouring schools. Feels that six storeys would have significant shading impacts on neighbouring properties and concern of long term impacts associated with increased density.

Mayor MacDonald invited members of the public to make comment for the third and final time. With no community members engaging, the public hearing was declared closed at 7:47 p.m.
