Hi Ashley,

Hope you are having a great day.

I just wanted to follow up on today's AAC meeting.

I'd like to address a few things. I understand the AAC's concerns- and I hope the following information can help provide some clarity.

A few things I think are very important to clarify

- Both of those accessories are sheds for farm equipment, not residential use, not garages. The reason we didn't apply for a bran instead is that we want these structures to match the home and look like they are residential and more importantly to preserve as much land as possible. These structures are located close to the home and not as large as a barn could be.
- 2ndly, the issue with the access, our neighbors 2 homes down, our relatives, have left the same amount of space and have been able to operate just fine. We had mentioned to you we're unsure which route we want to take in regard to the crops.
 Hay is an option as a committee member had mentioned. We believe there is plenty of space for farm equipment to get through as we do not plan to use any heavy duty machinery, Our tractors are small and we do not mind using our drive way as well as space on either side of the home for access. Lastly, we're more than happy to make adjustments to the site plan based on your feedback. The point is, we all have the same end goal in mind which is to make sure this farm is used for its intended purpose farming. We are looking at this as a collaborative approach to work together.
- I want to touch on a point above, regarding having a common goal. We wanted to start farming, we would have started as sooner but as we mentioned, it doesn't make any sense at this stage, the preload and construction will disturb the land.
 We never planned on this process taking so long and had things gone accordingly, farming would be under way. One of the first things we did when we moved in was buy a tractor, which we haven't even been able to utilize, but once we have a dirt permit and those early stages are complete we will be able to start farming right away.

I hope this email conveys our collaborative attitude and goals. We are desperate start farming and to start building. As you know this process has been very extensive and exhausting with all of the setbacks we have incurred. Its been over 18 months, we're just trying our best to make sure we're doing this

right and we're looking to the AAC for guidance on what we can do to move forward. We're happy to satisfy any requirements they have.
