K.1 UBCM Emergency Preparedness Fund – Reception Centre and Emergency Operations Centre Supplies

Barbara Morgan, Emergency Program Coordinator, provided an overview of the Staff Report including a PowerPoint presentation which is included as Attachment 1 and forms part of the original minutes.

It was **MOVED** and **SECONDED** THAT Council:

- A. Approve and support a joint grant application with Katzie First Nation, to the UBCM Emergency Preparedness Fund in the amount of \$50,000 to fund Emergency Support Services Reception Centre Supplies; AND
- B. Approve and support a grant application to the UBCM Emergency Preparedness Fund in the amount of \$25,000 to fund Emergency Operations Centre Workstation Chairs and Ham Radio Antenna to enhance communications and operations within the Emergency Operations Center ["EOC"].

K.2 Contract for Services – Ridge Meadows Search and Rescue

Fire Chief, Mike Larsson, provided an overview of the Staff Report including a PowerPoint presentation which is included as Attachment 2 and forms part of the original minutes.

It was **MOVED** and **SECONDED** THAT Council:

- A. Approve the renewal of the Contract for Services for the provision of Search and Rescue Services as outlined in Attachment B of the Staff Report dated February 11, 2022 with a yearly increase of 2.0%; AND
- B. Request that the Mayor and Corporate Officer execute the Contract not to exceed its 5 year term.

Council members participated in a roundtable discussion including the following topics:

- Enhanced communication strategies;
- business licensing costs;
- Utilizing Spirit Square;
- Parking requirements; AND
- The use of a summer student to support the program.

It was **MOVED** and **SECONDED** THAT Council:

A. Direct Staff to extend the Food Truck Pilot Program to run during the summer 2022 season based on Staff's recommended modifications as outlined in the report titled "Food Truck Pilot Program – Program Review and Update" dated February 8, 2022.

There was general consent amongst Council to amend the motion to include:

- Explore an opportunity for a summer student to provide administrative and communication support to the program; AND
- Expand the Food Truck Pilot Program to include all special event locations as best determined by Staff.

It was **MOVED** and **SECONDED** THAT Council provide flexibility to staff to determine optimal locations for food trucks, in consultation with the food truck vendors.

Before the question was called, it was **MOVED** and **SECONDED** THAT Council REFER the item back to staff for further consideration related to program costs and strategy.

L. <u>BYLAWS & PERMITS</u>

L.1 City of Maple Ridge Official Community Plan Referral – Lougheed Transit Corridor Area Plan and Development Permit Area Guidelines

Anne Berry, Director of Planning & Development, provided a verbal overview of the Staff Report including a PowerPoint presentation which is included as Attachment 4 and forms part of the original minutes.

Council members participated in a roundtable discussion including the following topics:

- Pedestrian safety concerns between 201st Street and Meadowtown Centre;
- Future population increase and impacts on traffic;
- Support from City of Maple Ridge and City of Port Coquitlam to improve traffic and accessibility of the entire Lougheed Highway corridor; AND
- Pitt Meadows staff to work with Maple Ridge staff on active transportation connectivity between the two communities.

It was **MOVED** and **SECONDED** THAT Council:

A. Direct Staff to send to the City of Maple Ridge a response in support of their proposed Official Community Plan amendments as outlined in the Staff Report dated February 23, 2022 and inclusive of Council's feedback provided at the March 1, 2022 Regular Council Meeting.

L.2 Development Variance Permit Application for 19880 Richardson Road

Anne Berry, Director of Planning & Development, provided an overview of the Staff Report including a PowerPoint presentation which is included as Attachment 5 and forms part of the original minutes.

Council members participated in a roundtable discussion.

It was **MOVED** and **SECONDED** THAT Council:

- A. Direct staff to notify surrounding residents that Development Variance Permit No. 2022-001 to reduce the minimum required setback to a watercourse for an agricultural building at 19880 Richardson Road from 15 metres to 11.46 metres will be considered at an upcoming Public Meeting of Council; AND
- B. Direct staff to expand the notification radius to 450m; AND
- C. REFER the application to the Agricultural Advisory Committee for comments and feedback.

The discussion continued and it was **MOVED** and **SECONDED** THAT Council AMEND the motion to include:

- D. Direct staff to ensure the removal of any hazardous materials associated with commercial use from the structure; AND
- E. Direct staff to register a covenant on title that would prevent commercial use of the structure which might involve the storage of roofing or hazardous materials;
- F. Direct staff to coordinate an inspection of the structure and foundation to ensure standards and guidelines [building and fire codes] have been upheld, with any and all costs associated with the inspection charged back to the applicant.
