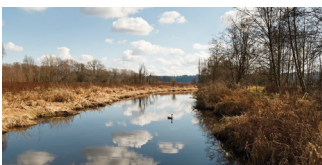
Housing Needs Assessment

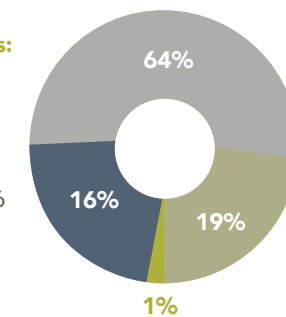
