1. Road and Rail Project Update

Joelle Westlund, Manager – Communications with the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority ["VFPA"], provided an overview of the engagement process including a PowerPoint presentation which is included as Attachment 1 and forms part of the original minutes.

Peter Cohen, Manager – Infrastructure & Delivery with VFPA, continued the presentation and spoke to the history and background of the Port of Vancouver and Vancouver Fraser Port Authority, as well as an overview of the Road and Rail project.

Jeffrey Knight, CP Rail, provided an overview of the rail configuration and components.

Mike LoVecchio spoke to the results of the recent rail configuration information sessions held April 21st and April 24th, 2021. Mr. LoVecchio then shared comments relating to the top 5 (five) questions received from those sessions.

Peter Cohen concluded the presentation with an overview of the noise and vibration study, findings and potential mitigation. Mr. Cohen then shared comments relating to the most common questions heard from recent engagement sessions.

Committee members participated in a roundtable discussion.

<u>Tracy Meeten</u>, Pitt Meadows – regarding the noise and vibration study and reference to current results exceeding Health Canada's guidelines. (by telephone)

<u>Adam Keizer</u>, Pitt Meadows – regarding appreciation for VFPA Staff providing clarity and for Council comments in support of mitigation. Would like to see action from the City to ensure proper mitigation for all of Pitt Meadows. (by telephone)

<u>Shannon Roberts, Pitt Meadows – regarding safety concerns and increasing rail incidents, specifically in Pitt Meadows and neighbouring communities.</u> (by telephone)

<u>Heather Anderson</u>, Pitt Meadows – regarding CP's safety record and existing rail operations that impact resident's health. (by telephone)

<u>Selim Mete</u>, Pitt Meadows – regarding existing noise impacts and the need for improved mitigation. (Attachment 2)

<u>Kim McLeod</u>, Pitt Meadows – regarding intentions for existing wall on north side and impacts on residential property lines. (Attachment 3)

<u>Shari Mahar</u>, Pitt Meadows – regarding health and safety concerns and quality of life due to poor air quality for those near the rail tracks. (Attachment 4)
