Mayor and Council

Council decided to rebuild the fire hall on the existing site, following months of careful analysis. Council met with Katzie First Nation (KFN) to discuss shared priorities including: truck traffic solutions, introduction of truck levies and lobbying senior government for a secondary access point to KFN lands.



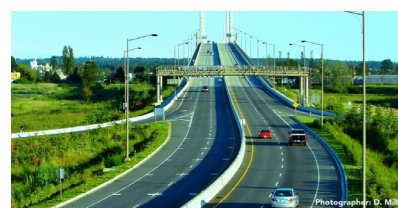
Community Engagement

Four new development projects approved at the Pitt Meadows Regional Airport following a series of public information sessions. Council adopted a new committee structure that will promote two-way dialogue and enable Council to explore topics in more detail with the community and committees.



Cultural Services

'Love of Landscapes' exhibition at the Pitt Meadows Art Gallery featured work by Connie-Jean Moore and Rob Egan from Feb 2 to Mar 31. First Annual Valentines Formal Swing Days featured the Bruce James Orchestra at South Bonson Community Centre.



Emergency Preparedness

The City received \$25,000 for evacuation route planning as part of the Province's Community Emergency Preparedness Fund. The City launched a series of free Neighbourhood Emergency Preparedness workshops in mid-March.



Events & Recreation

Pitt Meadows Family Rec Centre hosted the first-ever Family Day Carnival, attended by over 2600 people. There were a record number of attendees at the free Family Skate on February 18.



Finance

The City of Pitt Meadows received the Canadian Award for Financial Reporting for the City's 2017 Annual Report, for the fourth year in a row.



Fire & Rescue Services

Mike Larsson was selected as the new Fire Chief and two new Fire Service Technicians were hired to increase coverage. Pitt Meadows Fire & Rescue Service responded to two separate and significant fires on the morning of February 8.

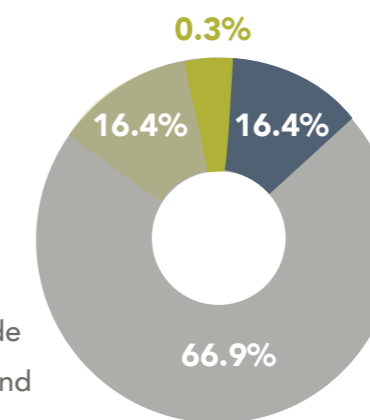
