## IN THE NEWS



### Mayor and Council

Council approved a new Strategic Plan to guide decision-making over their Council term. It lays out a clear path forward to ensure the City continues to provide superior service and meet the current and future needs by prioritizing important issues such as transportation, agriculture, the environment, public health, safety, quality of life and employee excellence.



### Community Service Awards

The City launched an annual Community Service Awards Program to recognize and honour outstanding contributions and achievements of groups, organizations and individuals. A citizen-led task force is responsible for reviewing nominations and selecting award recipients. Winners will be announced and presented with awards later this year.



### Community Engagement

The community was invited to attend the Fraser Way Roundabout and Park Public Engagement session on proposed long-term measures to address safety and maintenance.

Throughout the summer, community feedback was also sought about the North Lougheed Study Area and the Official Community Plan update.



### Pitt Meadows Art Gallery

The African Stone Carvings & Art exhibition at the Pitt Meadows Art Gallery featured contemporary stone sculptures, metal art, jewellery and hand-crafted baskets by Patrick Sephani and ZimCarvings from July 27 to September 8.



### Emergency Preparedness

The City received \$412,000 in funding as part of the Government of Canada's National Disaster Mitigation Program for the development of a Flood Mitigation Plan. The plan will identify gaps and develop priorities to protect residents, farms and businesses in the event of a flood or breach in our dike system. Council is advocating for regional leadership on this important initiative.



### Canada Day Celebration

Hundreds celebrated Canada's 152nd birthday in Spirit Square in Pitt Meadows with entertainment, artisans, a car show & shine, kids zone, food trucks, dog show, pancake breakfast, and so much more.



### Police Service Review

The City engaged a consultant to conduct a Policing Service Review. The review will look at current service levels and provide recommendations on what the best model for policing service is in order to enhance public safety. The review is expected to be complete by the end of 2019.

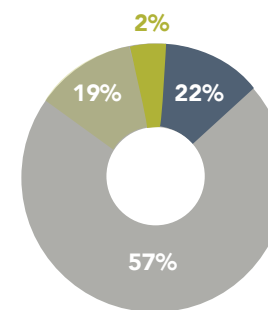
